Historical Society learns about early Panmure

Panmure Historical Society members Ted and Kate Haughey passed on their knowledge of the area now called Panmure. Ted told of the geological start and the violent volcanic activity that formed Tamaki Basin in 12 000 BC.

Tamaki River in those days was a small creek with a Maori village on the shores of the basin. In 7000BC Mangarei (Mt Wellington) erupted and the lava flowed into the basin and forced the spring water to push a way out into what became the Tamaki Estuary.

While recorded history only came about when the early European settlers arrived. the Maori who had settled on the high cliff with plenty of fresh water springs and volcanic soil to grow their vegetables had a well told verbal history. They travelled by canoe to another marae at Glen Innes and could move over to the Manukau through the portage track. Several tribes occupied this area through the years but the marauding Hone Hike in 1821 raided south with firearms that he had traded in the Bay of Islands. Capt. Downie, Master of the sailing ship "Coromandel" had been sent to try and make peace between the tribes of Inaki (Panmure) and Hone Hike from the Bay of Islands. Unfortunately the northerners laid siege to the pa, razed it to the ground and killed any survivors. The land was empty for some years.

Rev Selwyn Marsden in 1820-21 came to the area four times and reported noting the mile long village with plentiful storehouses full of potatoes, kumera, turnips etc. There were approximately 7000 people living in the Auckland area. In 1927 D'Urville reported seeing Maori people at the mouth of the Tamaki River but the hinterland was empty until it was subdivided for the early settlers.

In 1845 Governor Earl Grey, who was Lord Howick, encouraged the Fencibles to come to N.Z. for defence purposes and the Irish Catholic ex-servicemen signed up for 7 years service to get the land they were promised in recompense for leaving their homes.

A detachment of the 5th Irish Engineers came out and settled in the vicinity of Queens and Kings roads. Slowly the stores were built a general store, Post Office, several Hotels, butcher, baker, blacksmith and other tradesmen became established

A fishing factory was established by the newly built wharf and so the village grew. The old Stone cottage at Panmure is open every second Sunday to all visitors.

The Mangere Historical Society welcomes new members, and invites them to join them on the third Tuesday of the month at St James Hall Church Rd at 1.30p.m.

Hello everyone,

The Village has been very quiet, which is normal during cold, winter months. However, the Rimu Road over bridge is due to re-open to two-way traffic in early July so hopefully this should bring an improvement.

My time seems to have been taken up with CCTV, from which we have had some good success and Auckland Governance issues. There could be huge implications for us, as a Business Improvement District, depending on what model the new council decides to adopt. However, we can't assume it will adopt any model and therefore I have been in discussions with other Town Centre Managers from across Auckland. Having made great progress in the last five years it would be a tragedy to see local shopping centres deteriorate.

In discussion with the District Health Board, and as part of its Strategic Business Plan, the Business Association is looking at the long term healthcare needs for Mangere Bridge with a view to establishing a medical centre. A group of Mangere Bridge residents came together to form a local focus group (MICH - in the Bridge*) to consider the aspirations of our community in relation to the provision of primary healthcare services.

It is now time to ask for feedback from the wider Mangere Bridge community.

Last year Ambury Park Centre for Riding Therapy had an excellent Ribbon and Prize Giving day where their students ably demonstrated their skills. Students left Ambury Park Centre for Riding Therapy to do a further training course, a Foundation Course and an Early Childhood course at Unitec after achieving NCEA Level 2. Others took on further correspondence study, work as part of the family business and work experience in landscape garden work.

One student transitioned back into Elim College after achieving NCEA Level 2 and NCE Introductory Level in 2008. Overall in 2008 they had more students enrolled in and achieving results in NCEA. They have achieved the targets of achievement set for NCEA in 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008.

In both 2008 and 2009 the Centre has experienced a larger intake of Maori students and they are looking at how they can best support them to be successful in their learning.

The Centre Charter and Strategic Plans and the Centre Policies for the school have been updated and are available to view at the Centre. Their Centre Prospectus has also been updated and a copy given to each student.

The Educational Review Office visited the Centre on the 28th and 29th of April to review their Secondary School programme. The visit went well.

This year they have had a number of new students who have settled into the programme.



ICON Patrols While the Village Sleeps

Every newsletter ICON provide an update on reported crime and then outline areas in which business in the Village can take greater accountability for their own security (such as installing monitored alarms etc).

This month, a change, they have reported on some of the interesting things that their Patrol staff get involved with whilst most everyone else is safe at home.

ICON Group has at least 25 vehicles on the road every night checking on premises and attending alarm and noise control callout's.


All of their vehicles are fitted with GPS, both for safety and improved reporting, and each also is in car radio telephone communication with their 24 7 Call Centre.

Whilst the Patrols each have specified runs and duties, over recent years 'supplementary duties' have included:

- Delivering a baby
- Rescuing persons from a burning crashed vehicle
- Calming and restraining drunk drivers following vehicle accidents
- Putting out fires at a number of premises (mainly arson attacks)
- Photographing suspicious persons and their vehicles as a deterrent to move them out of industrial areas

They also work very closely with the Police and regularly assist with intelligence sharing and the apprehension of offenders.

Maybe security isn't as boring as one would sometimes imagine!
